It is our ambition at Sigglesothorne Church of England Primary Academy, to facilitate a blended learning approach. We have worked incredibly hard to ensure that our teachers are able to deliver a high-quality remote learning offer. Children will be able to access this offer whilst working at home or under the supervision of school staff. This means that, irrespective of how your child is learning, they will not be at a disadvantage.

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This week's Special mentions are:

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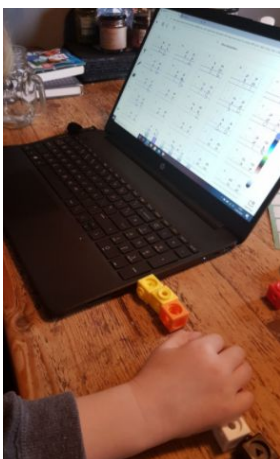


Mrs Wrightson's special mention goes to Ruby. This week the children were asked to recreate the front cover of our class story. Ruby has shown perseverance.
