

WW2

English & Maths

We will be following the White Rose mathematics scheme to develop our knowledge and understanding of place value and the four operations initially. The children will also continue to develop their fluency knowledge and skills of problem solving and reasoning. Where appropriate, maths will be taught in different contexts too.

English lessons will be cross-curricular using the topic of WW2. The children will look at poetry, diaries inspired by WW2, information texts on famous characters from WW2 and letter writing. We will begin by writing a setting description using photographs and videos for inspiration.

History / Geography

The children will find out about WW2 from its build up to conclusion. They will identify the key countries involved and the parts they played, from Dunkirk to VE Day.

Children will locate countries in Europe and the world using maps.

They will locate the most bombed city in England and describe how the features of the land have changed since the bombing.



<u>Science</u>

We will begin by looking at states of matter and the primary forms that substances take referring to solids, liquids and gasses. We will then examine the topic of electricity and discuss how circuits are made and how they are made more complex with switches and bulbs.

RE

Children's focus this term is about Justice and Freedom and how this manifests itself through beliefs and the way that people live.

Art

Children will work with pencil. They will practise and develop their pencil drawing technique and use this to create pictures inspired by artists at the time of WW2.

Computing

This term the children will look at using the internet as a source for their research and being responsible when using information from the internet in their own work. They will discuss and understand the term digital literacy and what this means for them.





P.S.H.C.E

This terms focus is keeping healthy.

They will explore various aspects of physical and mental health. This will also include healthy relationships on and offline.

Music

Children will continue to work with our music specialist focussing on pitch, pulse, rhythm and tempo. Children will also continue to learn how to appreciate and understand a wider range of high-quality music drawn from different traditions and from great composers and musicians; leading to children being encouraged to take part in their own musical class performances.

DT

Children will focus on the work of Henry Moore and use his work as inspiration to create a war memorial using papier mache.
